**ALL ABOUT KWANZAA**

Kwanzaa is a holiday that was created to celebrate the people of African descent. It is not a religious holiday or a day to honor a famous person. If someone celebrates Kwanzaa, it doesn't mean that they don't celebrate Christmas. The two holidays do not have anything in common except for when they are first.

Kwanzaa lasts seven days and comes from the Swahili word that means "first." It is celebrated from December 26<sup>th</sup> through January 1<sup>st</sup>. Currently Kwanzaa is celebrated by millions of people around the world and highlights the best of what it means to be a human being. During this time, people pledge to work together.

**ALL ABOUT KWANZAA**

The most popular symbol is the kinaru. The kinaru is a holder with 7 candles: three green candles, and one black candle. The green stands for the people, struggle, and green for hope. Each candle represents a principle.

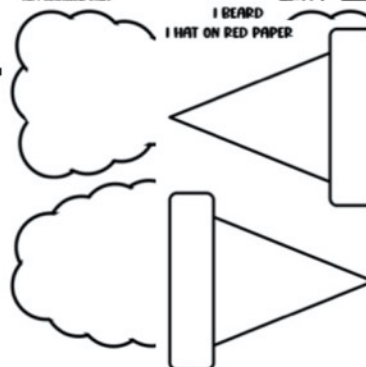

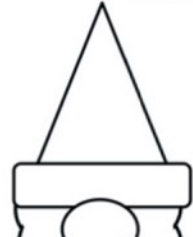

Does your family celebrate Las Posadas? This holiday has been around for over 400 years! Las Posadas is a celebration in Mexico and some parts of the United States. It is 9 days long and starts on December 16<sup>th</sup>. The word *posada* means "inn." Las Posadas is a religious holiday that tells the story of Mary and Joseph.

Each evening during the festival, a small child dressed as an angel leads a procession through the streets of the town. The children following the angel dress in silver and gold robes.

The children stop at homes asking for lodging for Mary and Joseph. At each home, the children are told there is no room for them, so they go to the next house.

**CHRISTMAS IN MEXICO**

The procession of churches where communities come together. Children bring tamales that are filled with candy. Families and friends eat tamales and drink hot chocolate.

**CHRISTMAS IN MEXICO**

Christmas Eve in Mexico is known as Nochebuena. This is a day where families share their main Christmas meal. They also attend church together. In parts of Mexico, children go to bed expecting Santa Claus to bring them gifts in the night.

Other areas of Mexico celebrate de los Reyes on January 6<sup>th</sup>. When going to bed, children place their shoes out for the Three Kings. In the morning, the shoes are filled with gifts, or candy from the Three Kings.
