BEFORE READING

QUESTIONS

BEFORE READING

BEFORE READING

Preview the text, what predictions can you make about the setting of the story?

BEFORE READING

Preview the text. Is this story fiction or nonfiction? How do you know?

BEFORE READING

What do you know about the topic of this story? Does anything look familiar?

BEFORE READING

What characters do you think will be in the story? Why do you think this?

BEFORE READING

Does the topic of this story remind you of anything that you have seen or done before?

BEFORE READING

What question(s) would you ask the author before reading this story?

BEFORE READING

Look at the front and back cover. Ask a question you have while looking at the covers.

BEFORE READING

Preview the text. Are you excited to read this story? Why or why not?

DURING READING

Pause while reading. Predict what will happen next.

DURING READING

Pause while reading. What do you think about the text so far? Explain.

DURING READING

How do you think the character will handle the current problem?

DURING READING

What emotions is the character feeling? How do you know?

DURING READING

As you are reading, visualize what is happening. What do you see?

DURING READING

Pause while you are reading. What question(s) do you have about the story?

DURING READING

Before finishing the story, explain what has happened to the character so far.

DURING READING

Are the predictions you made before reading correct? Explain.

DURING READING

Who is telling this story? How do you know?

DURING READING

Are the predictions you made before reading correct? Explain.

Is the story making sense to you so far? Why or why not?

DURING READING

Does this story remind you of anything? Explain.

DURING READING

How do the illustrations in the story make you feel? Explain.

Do you have anything in common with the character? Explain.

DURING READING

As you are reading, think about your senses. What would you see, taste, hear, or feel if you were a character in the story?

AFTER READING

Who are the characters in the story? Choose one character to describe.

AFTER READING

Explain what happened at the beginning of the story.

AFTER READING

Explain what happened in the middle of the story.

AFTER READING

Explain what happened at the end of the story.

AFTER READING

What was the main problem of the story? How was it solved?

AFTER READING

What could the character do differently next time?

AFTER READING

Write a brief summary of the story in your own words.

AFTER READING

What is a lesson you can learn after reading this story?

AFTER READING

What is this story trying to teach us? Why do you think that is?

AFTER READING

What is the moral of the story? Explain it in your own words.

AFTER READING

Discuss how the character changed throughout the story.

AFTER READING

What words in the text tell me how the character is feeling?

AFTER READING

What illustrations help you know how the character is feeling? Explain.

AFTER READING

Did the illustrations give you new information about the story? Explain.

AFTER READING

If this story had a sequel, predict what would happen next.

After reading, think of three questions to ask the author.

Choose 2 characters. How are they alike? How are they different?

Think of another title you could give this story.
